## EARLY SETTLER LIFE *Our Most Popular Program!*

This program allows your students to explore the development of the family farm in the 1800s. Tour the Pioneer Log Cabin and Victorian farmhouse where we will explore 19<sup>th</sup> century life.

### VICTORIAN KITCHEN

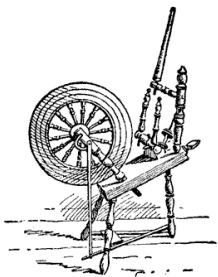
*Single Class (max of 26 students)*

### SEASONAL HOLIDAY CRAFT

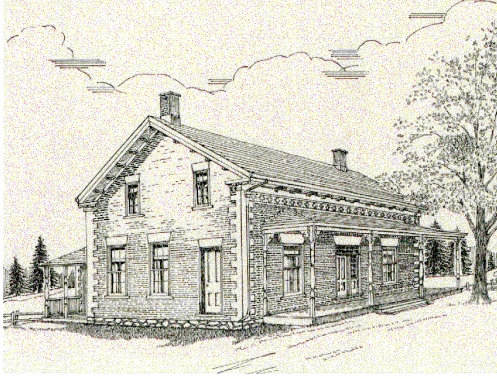
Discuss traditional gift giving & create up to two seasonal holiday crafts

## DISCOVER FIRST NATIONS: ARCHAEOLOGY, CULTURE, & CONTACT

This two-part full day program has been created to supplement the Grade 6 Ontario Social Studies Curriculum. It highlights unique details from the Mantle Site, a large 9-acre village that has yielded evidence of over 70 longhouses and tens of thousands of artifacts. Students will investigate the life of the Wendat by becoming "Junior Archaeologists". Students will also explore life in a pre-contact Wendat Village through the use of themed Discovery Boxes.

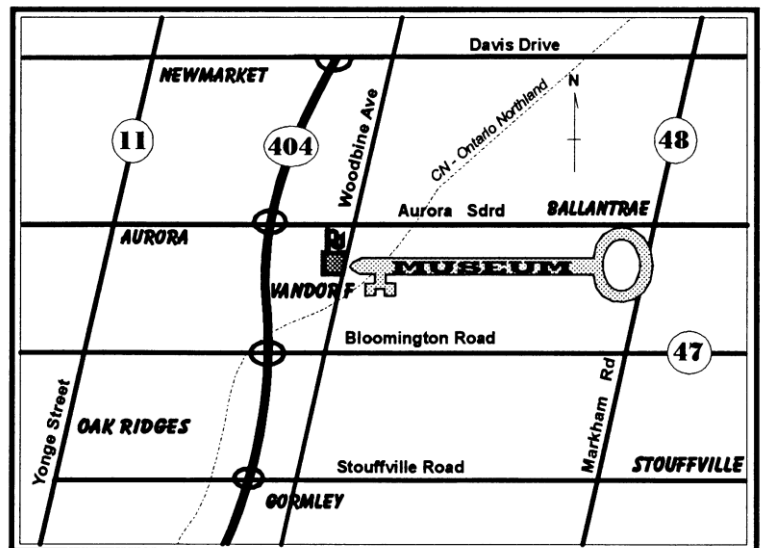

### OUR LOCATION

The WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE MUSEUM is conveniently located just off Hwy 404 at 14732 Woodbine Avenue in the hamlet of Vandorf, 3 kms north of Bloomington Road. The five buildings on site include the brand new visitor/community centre, two century schoolhouses, a log cabin, a barn, and a farmhouse restored to the 1880 period. The adjacent Vandorf Park provides excellent picnic and playground facilities for classes spending the day at the Museum.  
(Indoor eating facilities also available.)
